They also had a visit from Mr Sherwood who talked about how he uses lighthouses in his job at the Naval Base in Portsmouth.

Year 3 went out on a walk to learn about Chichester in the past. They visited the Bishop's Palace Gardens and then, because they were reading Paradise Garden by Colin Thompson, the children created and painted their own ideas of a paradise garden which really helped them show their creative flair. They have also made picture frames in DT to give as gifts at Christmas.





Year 4 visited Butser Ancient Farm to get some first-hand experience of life in the Stone Age. They saw ancient breeds of sheep and houses built with materials and in the style used in ancient times. As you can see from the picture, they had really good weather. They used the facts and information



they had found out to develop their learning back at school.

Year 5 had one of our very popular dressing up days and learnt how Saxons used their shields in battle.
