Year 2 - Curriculum Letter - Autumn Term

Welcome to Year 2! I am really looking forward to working with your children, in partnership with you, to ensure that they have a very happy and successful year.

I have already met lots of the Year 2 parents since the start of term, but please do come and say 'hello' if I haven't seen you yet! I am looking forward to getting to know you all over the coming weeks.

The purpose of this autumn term curriculum letter is to give you some useful information about the topics, routines and expectations of our class, which I hope you will find both informative and helpful in assisting your child during their first term in Year 2.

An Important Year

Year 2 is an important and exciting year for your child. This is the final year of Key Stage 1 (Infants) and, as you may be aware, it is the year in which your child will be taking the National Curriculum End of Key Stage 1 Assessment Tests during the summer term. This means the pace and intensity of the work we do will gradually build up and it is important that the children miss as little as possible of the curriculum.

Encouraging Independence

I have been very impressed with how all of the children are coming into the classroom by themselves and taking responsibility for sorting out their own belongings (e.g. coat, book bag, lunch box etc), without relying on the help of parents! This is an important step forwards in encouraging the development of their independence and organisational skills. Thank you for your support with this.

Reminders

- School reading books will be taken home on a regular basis and reading at home is
 essential; daily if possible. We encourage the children to visit the library and to read
 other books at home, as well as those from the school reading scheme. This could
 include fiction and non-fiction books, children's newspapers, joke books and magazines/comics.
 In fact, the wider the range of genres that your child reads, the better! Reading with your child
 regularly, and discussing books with them, will not only help them to develop their fluency and
 comprehension skills but will also help them to foster a real love of reading.
- Homework is set on a Friday and is to be returned by the following Wednesday please. This will be given out in a clear plastic wallet with the task sheet inside.
- Spellings will be sent home on a Monday to be learned ready for a test on the Friday. This
 routine will begin in a couple of weeks.
- The children are expected to be able to fluently recall and use the multiplication and division facts for the 2x, 5x and 10x multiplication tables by the end of Year 2. Whilst we won't be having any formal 'tables tests' yet, it would be helpful if you could begin practising these multiplication tables with your child at home, by counting in steps of each number and by chanting the multiples lists (e.g. 0, 2, 4, 6, 8, 10).
- Painting overalls and P.E. kits should be left in school all week from Monday morning, as the children may need them for lessons, clubs and ad-hoc sporting activities at different points during the week. P.E. kits will be sent home on Fridays.

- Please send a note in if your child has a verruca and cannot do P.E. barefooted or if your child is unable to take part in P.E. for a medical reason. For safety reasons, no watches or jewellery should be worn during P.E. lessons. If your child wears earrings and it is not possible for them to be removed for P.E., please let me know.
- The children are welcome to bring one small, 'pocket-sized' toy to school for playtimes. Please ensure that this toy is small enough to fit in their drawer or in the small toy box in the classroom. We also ask that toys are not valuable, fragile or electrical.
- Unfortunately, in Year 2 we only have a very limited time for 'Show and Tell'. However, we will endeavour to have a weekly session each Friday afternoon, to allow the children time to share any exciting news or items with the class. As in Year 1, this will be done on a group by group basis and the children will be told in advance which group's turn it will be each week, in order to give them time to prepare. Please encourage your child to only bring in items that will be of real interest to others in the class! This might include items that are related to our current topics and learning, or souvenirs and/or photos from a recent special event, experience, day trip or holiday. Please remind your child that they should be able to talk about their items/experiences in some detail, in order to make it worthwhile sharing with the rest of the class!

This term

Lighthouses

This term will be an exciting and stimulating one, with many cross-curricular links. This means that there will be strong links between subjects and children can see their learning as being connected, relevant and purposeful. Our main topic for the term is 'Lighthouses' in which we will focus on learning about lighthouses and the story of Grace Darling. This topic will also have links with literacy, maths, science, design and technology, history, art and computing. The children have already thought of questions relating to Lighthouses that they would like us to find the answers to over the term and we will soon begin to share the 'Lighthouse Keeper' stories together.

Ideas for supporting your child's learning:

- Practise mental maths skills such as counting on and back in steps of 1, 2, 5 and 10 from zero, recalling the number bonds to ten and playing games using a 100 square more details to follow in this week's homework!
- Generate sentences using your child's spelling words;

- Use the internet and/or visit the local library to research information about Lighthouses!
