**Adverse Weather –** You may have heard that there is snowy weather forecast for the end of the week. It looks unlikely that this will affect the south too much however I just want to remind you how school closure (and opening) information is passed on.



Decisions to close the school are only made where there is a concern about the safety of the children on that day. The school could be closed (or partially closed) if there are insufficient staff able to come to school because of difficulties with their own journey or if emergency vehicles would be unable to access the site. There are other reasons including loss of power, telephones or water that can also have an impact.

School closure would be announced on the school website and through an announcement on the radio (Spirit FM). If possible a text will be sent to all parents to keep you informed but this should not be relied on as the main source of information (please let us know if you have changed your number recently). Schools are required to notify the Local Authority of closure.

**New Dates** – the class assembly dates have been sent out separately, please make a note in your diaries it is always wonderful to see so many of you there. We will be holding a Grounds Day next half term and are just waiting to confirm the date. We had a fabulous turn out last time so please come if you can. Your help is very much appreciated.

Year R and KS1 Christmas performances – while things are fresh in our minds we are reviewing arrangements for Christmas and getting plans in place for this coming year. We are aware that the younger children are extremely tired by 6pm and are considering doing two day time performances instead (9.30 and 2pm.). This would make sure that everyone is involved in all performances and avoid the late evening for the children. We would be able to make the date known to families at the start of the term enabling you to arrange time off to come. Lottery Bid – I am delighted to be able to let you know that the school has successfully bid for a grant of £10,000 from the Big Lottery Fund.

This will be to refurbish the hut so that it provides a better places for pupil's to work and for interventions such as play therapy to take place. It will continue to be used for music and also for community use by the Friends. Once the work is complete (we anticipate this happening in March), we will be exploring how we can make more use of the new, improved space. Our thanks go to Claire Few, one of the school governors, for her work in writing the bid so successfully.

Children's Music Concerts – we will be taking almost a quarter of the school to the Chichester Festival Theatre next week on the 17<sup>th</sup> January for the children's concert. Tickets have all been allocated now and we were very fortunate to secure so many this year due to Mrs Turner's quick thinking last spring when the dates first came out. I am sure we will have a lovely time. Year 5 will also be performing at the Festival Theatre on the 19<sup>th</sup> January. Year 5 families were given details of the ticketing arrangements last term.
