

Shrek Junior - The Musical

After the success of last years' production of 'The Jungle Book - Kid's' plans are already underway for a whole school summer production which we are pleased to announce will be Shrek - The Musical JR. On Thursday of last week, eight of our Year 3s and 4s went to Bishop Luffa School to take part in "The Road to Eastbourne" - a tennis-themed festival to promote tennis as the football season starts to wane and tennis appears on our screens! The children, as always, did us proud, and it was great to see them encourage one another and work together so positively. We won the event for the Chichester-based schools, and came second across Bognor and Chichester - a great result! Within school, our Year 5s have been using the new laptops in their weekly Computing sessions and they have developed their "vector drawing" skills. Vector drawing is a digital image creation process that uses mathematical equations and geometric shapes to define an image, rather than individual pixels like is raster graphics. This week, they learned how to layer and group shapes within the image they were creating, and were tasked to draw mushrooms - can you guess which was the model mushroom, and which were the children's amazing efforts?
