On Tuesday, we were delighted to welcome an Australian family to our Key Stage 2 assembly. Having seen on social media that the family of 5 were cycling around the world, and currently in Chichester, we reached out to them and invited them to come and speak to us!

Andrew and Nicola, both Australian teachers, are travelling with their three children (ages 2, 9 and 11) around the world on their bikes, and trying to visit schools on their route to inspire children and talk about their adventures.

They arrived with us just before 10 and rolled into assembly and spoke to the children for about 25 minutes about their travels so far - from Tasmania where they are from, across the salt flats of Columbia and to Chichester before their next stop, the Isle of Wight! From there, they are travelling to Wales, Ireland, Scotland and then on to the Netherlands... and onwards! Our children were able to see part of the route that they had travelled, share some of their photos and ask questions.

Eli shared a PowerPoint presentation all about Down Syndrome which he had written himself. Eli also introduced us to his little brother Zeke, who has Down Syndrome, and we were thrilled to learn about some of the amazing things that Zeke is already doing with his life, including completing a sponsored walk to raise money for The Sussex Snowdrop Trust.
