Where our pupils travel from	Jessie Younghusband School is located in the north west area of Chichester. It is a 1960s built school on a large shared campus site with St Anthony's Special School, they share a vehicle access via Woodlands Lane from St Paul's Road and there is a pedestrian access out onto Norwich Road. The school's main catchment area is the two modern housing estates that surround it, the remainder of its catchment is part of the Summersdale area which is some distance away.  There are a several children who travel from outside the catchment, either from other areas of Chichester or the surrounding villages.

Transportation Links	
Walking Routes*	St Paul's Road is the closest main road for access to school. There is a pedestrian crossing towards the Chichester City Centre direction but for children coming from north west of this or from the Parklands area there is a busy main road to cross. Children from the Summersdale area need to use the pedestrian crossing on the A286 Broyle Road and walk through a footpath into Norwich Road. Most local roads have pavements but there are often a significant number of cars parked along the road to the rear of the school (Norwich Road) which can present difficulties for safe crossing.
Cycling Routes*	The Centurian Way cycle path is close to school and is used by some cyclists and as a safe walking route for some school visits.  There are well signed cycle routes around Chichester city centre, however they are alongside the main traffic routes in this area of the city.






