Spotlight on "The Corporate Challenge"

What is it?

The Corporate Challenge is a unique series of evening road races for all ages and abilities, run around Chichester city centre. Distances range from 1400m for primary school children up to 4.5km for adults. Races start at the Assembly Rooms on North Street and are conducted under UK Athletics rules.

Each year, this event is offered to all of the pupils in Years 5 and 6, and every year there is always a large number of children who put themselves forward to compete, and a wide range of abilities. What surprises everybody on their first run is how busy it is and how many people come out to support the runners.

On Wednesday this week, we had 26 children turn out in the dark, cold and rain to run through the city streets. All of the children pushed themselves to do their best, "encouraged" by Mr Neaves' shouts (he had no voice left Thursday morning!) and cheered on by the hundreds of onlookers. It was lovely to see so many children taking part, and to witness them supporting each other when they weren't running. We even had children from Year 5 who weren't running - as well as former Jessie students - come along to support those who were.
