## **Sporting News**



The children have been very active this term and they have not let the weather discourage them from their PE lessons! As part of our PE Curriculum, we have involved the children in a variety of sporting events organised by the West Sussex West School Sport Partnership. Because of current restrictions, the children have not been able to compete against other schools in person, as they normally would do. All of the events so far have taken place in the children's 'bubbles' and for some events we have been able to compete against other schools 'virtually'.

Early in October we took part in a 'virtual athletics' event, which included jumping, throwing and running activities. All years 3-6 took part and had a great time. Overall, Year 5 and Year 6 finished 3<sup>rd</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> respectively. An extra well done goes to Oscar D (Year 6), who scored the highest score in his category across all schools.

Across all year groups, the children have, as part of their PE lessons, been running (you may have noticed muddy shoes from time to time). Year 5 and 6 children were able to enter the SSG Cross country competition and as a school, we finished a fantastic 2<sup>nd</sup> overall! A particular well done to lona, Ava, Olive, Matty, Oscar C, Joshua P, Jake and Edward who all managed to make the top 15 in their category out of 431 runners!

In November, both Year 1 and 2 took part in and 'Infant agility' competition, and like the virtual athletic events the children took part in a variety of different throwing, catching, balancing, jumping and running activities. Both classes did amazingly well and Year 2 were delighted to find out they finished 1<sup>st</sup> in their category! A special mention to Valentina and George who scored the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> highest score across all schools respectively; Jacob for the best bouncer score; and Shiori and Kian for best Bowler score.



In December, Year 2 also entered a virtual Dance Festival. Despite the event being cancelled, the children's final performance was great and they really enjoyed themselves.

## **Covid in the Christmas period**

Once again, we would like to thank you in all of your support this term, especially in your wearing of face-coverings around the site to try and protect us all.
