Sienna: I loved camp, even though it was cold in the night - it was fun!

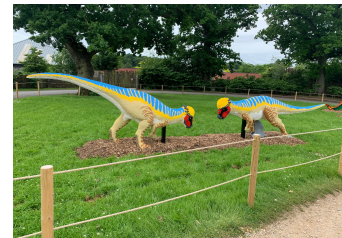
Fraser: I love the photo of a baby monkey that Emily gave me (at the zoo) and seeing a giraffe!
