Forest School

Our first topic of the half term is Forest School. The children have already begun taking part in this exciting series of lessons which allow children to explore their natural environment, learn practical skills and take part in some active experiences outside of the classroom. I know both groups have really enjoyed the sessions so far and are look forward to more sessions outside in the summer term.

As a reminder, children should come to school on these Tuesday mornings wearing suitable clothes for being outside whatever the weather. In particular, they must have long trousers – shorts are not ideal when walking through long grass, even if it may be sunny and hot.

We have not, as yet, had any volunteers to help with Group 2's sessions – if you are able to help between 9 and 12 on these dates, it would be greatly appreciated. Ancient Greece

Our second topic for the summer, starting after half term, will be Ancient Greece. We will have the opportunity to find out about this fascinating civilisation which was the birthplace to many things we still recognise and use to this day, like the alphabet, democracy and the Olympic Games. As part of Ancient Greece topic, we will be hosting a Greek themed dress-up day on Wednesday 26th June, where we will be joined by local history expert Paul Ullson – I would greatly appreciate your help in organising a costume for your child on this day to help us immerse ourselves in our learning.

P.E.

In the summer term, we will be taking part in cricket, athletics and rounders during our PE sessions. Our lessons will continue to be held on Wednesday afternoon and Thursday mornings. It is, however, useful to have PE kit in school all week from Monday morning, as the children may need them for clubs and occasionally for ad-hoc sporting activities at different points during the week. We do have an increasing number of children who do not have the correct kit with them – although we do have spares in school to ensure that everyone can take part, this isn't ideal. Please take the opportunity to double check that your child's PE kit contains a top, pair of shorts, and trainers that fit ahead of the summer term.

Reading

Regular reading is essential, daily if possible. This could include school reading books (fiction and non-fiction), magazines, comics or anything else which takes their interest. In fact, the wider the range of genres that your child reads the better. We will begin to think this year about how to tailor writing for different audiences, purposes and genres, so reading a range of texts will help them really understand how writing differs depending on the context. Reading comment books will continue to be used to record reading progress – we really appreciate your continued effort here. Please encourage your child to put their reading comments book and reading book back in their book bags each night so that they are available during the school day.

Home learning

A home learning task will be set once each week, typically in either Literacy or Maths but occasionally in other subjects as well. Home learning aims to reinforce a key concept the children have learnt at school. This will usually be set each Tuesday and due in again the following Monday. Additional copies of the homework, if required, are left in folders in the classroom. Occasionally you may wish to add a comment on to your child's homework if there is anything you feel I should know about how they got on. Spellings also form part of their home learning and will also be given out and tested every Tuesday. We really appreciate your continued support in helping your child to complete their home learning on time.
