We are looking forward to other fund-raising opportunities as we go through the year, and hope that we are soon in a position to lift some of the restrictions on us.



Behaviour Questionnaire

Thank you to the families who sent back in their responses to the behaviour questionnaire that I sent out on 6th October. 100% of the parents who replied said that their child was happy at the school, their child felt safe at the school, their child was well looked after at school and that the school responds well to any concerns that are raised. They also all said that they would recommend JYS to other parents. 67% felt that bullying was dealt with effectively, and although nobody said that they didn't feel it was dealt with, the other answers stated assumptions and opinions that they had. The areas that we are currently working on as a staff in the re-writing of the behaviour policy are also the areas that parents have indicated that they are less clear – these are the rewards and incentives for children, and the warnings and consequences system.

Once we are satisfied with how this should read on the policy, we will share it with you all and talk it through with the children – we have also asked the children about their thoughts on the behaviour policy. There are lots of things that the children enjoy about school. Of these, a common theme throughout the school is that they enjoy having – and playing with – friends. They also commented on "feeling safe", having "nice teachers" and "good learning"! "Good behaviour" is seen as "being nice or being kind", "respecting others, equipment and property" and "listening". We help pupils make right choices through "encouraging them", "house points" and "discussing good and bad choices".

Some children feel that others are "getting too little in the way of punishment", but when it comes to bullying, it is "often taken to a higher level", that "teachers are always around to speak to" and "we are told and taught not to bully, and taught where to go and what to do if we are bullied". These last messages will have been re-enforced in our Friendship Week this week.
